Dear Parishioners, having returned from the Legion of Mary Jubilee Pilgrimage a week ago, I wanted to share with you some experiences of our pilgrim group at many different shrines in France and Ireland during these weeks. (Though I then had to return home, the other pilgrims continued to Italy - Rome, Assisi, Loreto, Florence, Venice.)



We were first in Lourdes, famous of course for the appearances of Our Lady to St Bernadette in 1858 and for the numerous medically-verified miraculous healings that have occurred there ever

since. Here we took part with huge crowds of pilgrims in the weekly International Mass, in the Eucharistic Procession and the evening Torchlight Procession.




For the whole pilgrimage I was praying for our parishioners and partnered parishes, but in particular at the Grotto where Our Lady appeared, I prayed for you individually by name, as many as I could remember. Some members of

our group bathed in the healing waters, and had the privilege of leading the Rosary at the Grotto.

From Lourdes we travelled to Lyon, which was our base for visiting La Salette and Ars. La Salette in the French Alps



was the location of the 1846 appearance of Our Lady to the shepherd children Mélanie Calvat and Maximin Giraud, in which she warned against and lamented blasphemy and sabbath violation.



Ars was the parish of St John Vianney (1786-1859), patron saint of parish priests; his incorrupt body is in the



basilica there. Here I prayed for our own Parkdale church of St John Vianney; for

priests and bishops, especially those who have helped me on my own life-journey; and for my own priestly ministry.


At Paray-le-Monial we prayed in the Basilica of the Sacred heart, as well as in the chapel where the revelations (1673-75) of Our Lord to St Margaret Mary Alacoque established devotion to the Sacred Heart in its modern form. The universal Church has just finished



a year of celebration for the 350th anniversary of the apparitions, which Pope Francis marked in his last encyclical, *Dilexit Nos*, on the Sacred Heart.

In Nevers we visited the convent where St Bernadette lived out her vocation. We prayed in the presence of her incorrupt body, and I celebrated Mass for the pilgrims in the very room of her painful illness and death - the place where she entered eternal life. Here both aspects of Our Lady's words to her came true: 'I do not promise you happiness in this world, but in the other.'

Proceeding to Paris, I was able to concelebrate Mass in Notre-Dame Cathedral, now gloriously restored after the 2019 fire. [continued p. 3]

Priestly Ordination for the Archdiocese of Melbourne — Father John Vespa

We congratulate and keep in our prayers Rev Fr John Vespa, ordained priest for the Archdiocese of Melbourne by Pope Leo XIV in St Peter's Basilica on Friday 27th June, Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, which is also the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests.

Fr Vespa was one of 32 deacons from around the world, and the only Australian, chosen for priestly ordination by the Holy Father on this occasion of the 'Jubilee of Priests' - one of many special celebrations for particular groups in the Jubilee Year. During the ceremony he was vested in priestly stole and chasuble by Very Rev Fr Cameron Forbes, Rector of our Melbourne seminary, Corpus Christi College (and most recently Parish Priest of Mentone-Parkdale). Archbishop Comensoli was also in attendance. Fr Vespa celebrated his First Mass of Thanksgiving the following day at Domus Australia, the Australian pilgrim centre in Rome.

The Feast of the Sacred Heart was chosen for the Jubilee of Priests because of the close link of the Priesthood to Our Lord's Sacred Heart: 'The priest continues the work of redemption on earth.... If we really understood the priest on earth, we would die not of fright but of love.... the Priesthood is the love of the heart of Jesus.' (*Catechism of the Catholic Church* n. 1589, quoting the Cure of Ars, St John Vianney, Patron Saint of Parish Priests)

'The harvest is rich, but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the harvest to send labourers to his harvest.' (Lk 10:2)
The words of Jesus in today's Gospel remind us to always pray for vocations to Priesthood and Consecrated Life.









[continued from p. 1] I celebrated a public Mass in the



Chapel of Our Lady of the Miraculous Medal in the Rue du Bac, where Mary appeared in 1830 to Daughter of Charity, St Catherine Labouré (1806-76), giving her instruction on the design and distribution of the new medal.



St Catherine's incorrupt body is on the sanctuary, as are the relics of St Louise de Marillac (1591-1660), co-founder with St Vincent de Paul of the Daughters of Charity. Our pilgrims led the singing for the Mass, and in my homily I gave

testimony of my own experience of Our Lady's special help through this famous medal.



Round the corner we visited the Chapel of St Vincent de Paul (1581-1660), and prayed in the presence of his relics. I prayed especially for the St Vincent de Paul Society throughout the world, and in particular for the three Conferences operating in our own Parishes.

Other destinations in Paris for our pilgrims included the Basilica of Sacré-Cœur in Montmartre, and the Basilica of Saint-Denis - the first church built in the full Gothic style, and burial place of French monarchs.

A day trip from Paris into Normandy took us to Lisieux and Alençon, associated with St Thérèse of the Child Jesus (1873-97), and her parents, Sts Louis and Zélie



Martin - the first saints to be canonised as a married couple. In Lisieux, we visited the majestic Basilica of St Thérèse; the family home; and the Carmelite Convent where St Thérèse lived out her vocation and wrote her famous spiritual autobiography, published after her death as *Story of a Soul*. In Alençon we visited St Thérèse's birthplace.

The day finished with Mass at the imposing Chartres Cathedral, with its stained glass considered a prime example in the whole world of this art.

SAINT OF THE WEEK 7 July: Blessed Peter To Rot, Martyr

The first *beatus* (and soon-to-be first saint) of Papua New Guinea, Peter To Rot was born in 1912, the son of a village chief on the island of New Britain. Missionaries had been active in New Guinea and in Papua especially from the late 1800s, and Peter's parents were adult converts. After studies from 1930, in 1933 Peter was appointed lay catechist in his village of Rakunai, near Rabaul. In 1936, he married Paula la Varpit, and they had three children.

With the Japanese occupation in World War II from March 1942, all missionaries and their staff were arrested, so Peter was left in charge of the parish. He continued to lead the faithful of the village — baptising, witnessing marriages, conducting Communion services, teaching, visiting the sick and taking food to prisoners.

Persecution intensified, but against the Japanese prohibition, Peter continued his activities in secret, despite the risks. When he spoke out against the Japanese promotion of polygamy, this angered the occupying forces, and he was watched more carefully. Reported for his parish activities, he was arrested, beaten and imprisoned. In the prison camp at Rakunai, he was killed by lethal injection about 7 July 1945, aged 33.

St John Paul II beatified Peter To Rot in Port Moresby in 1995. Pope Francis approved his canonisation on 31 March this year, and Pope Leo XIV will perform the canonisation on 19 October.

Papua New Guinea today has about two million Catholics, 26% of the population; another 70% are non-Catholic Christians, and only 4% are non-Christian.
